Introduction


The Extended I/O Card provides an additional two 12V Powered USB Ports and two RS-232 Powered Serial Ports for the 7606.

Each serial port has a selection jumper on Pin 9 which can provide 5V/12V or RI. This pin is capable of supporting up to 1.5A max and is protected with a self healing polyfuse. The two ports are connected to COM 3 and COM 4 on the Motherboard.

Note: This board cannot be used in a terminal that is configured with an internal UPS because the UPS uses COM4.

The 12V Powered USB ports are capable of supplying 12V at 1.5A maximum each.




Installation Procedures

Caution: Static Electricity Discharge may permanently damage your system. Discharge any static electricity build up in your body by touching your computer's case for a few seconds. Avoid any contact with internal parts and handle cards only by their external edges.


- 1. Turn Off the power to the terminal and disconnect any peripheral devices. Unplug the terminal's power cord.
- 2. Remove the Front Cover.
 - a. Turn the Keylock to the unlocked position.
 - b. Pull the top edge of the Front Cover away from the chassis and remove the cover.




- 3. Remove the Top Cover.
 - a. Loosen the thumbscrews (2) that secure the Top Cover.




b. Slide the cover toward the rear of the terminal to remove it.



4. Set the jumpers on the Extended I/O Board to meet your requirements.




5. Remove the Blank I/O Bracket from the back of the terminal chassis (one screw).

- 6. Install the board assembly in terminal chassis where you removed the Blank I/O Bracket.
 - a. Slide the assembly to the left to connect the hook on the end of the bracket into the chassis.
 - b. Secure the assembly with the screw.
 - c. Connect the cables as identified below.
